FACE COVERINGS (masks or shields):

- -Upon the Governor's directive, face coverings will be worn by students 5 years old and above, depending on the active case count in the school's county. Face coverings are encouraged. Face coverings must be worn when the active case count is 4 or more. With the additional clarification from the Governor as of 8/20/20 face coverings may be removed in our class spaces, as weare able to social distance in those areas. Teachers teaching one on one must adhere to the face covering mandates, as well as their student.
 - Adminwill check the Health Dept report eachday, to determine the next day's protocol. If there is achange, parents will benotified via Messenger, and students and staff will be notified over the inter-com. District will provide facecoverings, if students/staff request them. They may bring their ownfrom home, but must washthem each evening before wearing them the next day.
 - Masks provided by the school are disposable and good for one day. Shields provided by school will be worn home and then back to school. Teachers will have all students sanitize their shield during announcements.

Protocol for spring activities:

Lambert Public School and the Board of Trustees has decided to allow fans to attend HSbasketball games (alambert on atrial basis, and with the following VERYMPORTANT COMD-19 protocol, in order to do our best to keep our athletes, fans, and communities safe: Spring activities will resume as normal, but protocol by host must be adhered to, as is necessary (MCT, M-SAprotocol for spring sports, etc) 1. Please be courteous and stay home if you are sick and/or showing any symptoms of illness.

2. Please wear a face covering at all times in the building.

3. Farsmust sit in family pods and in the reserved section for your team (this will be marked off). Students/young people may attend but only in the care of their parent(s) or another adult family member.
